We would like children to select at least one of the homework challenges below for this term; however, children can do as many as they wish. This will continue to be run alongside the regular reading, spellings and maths homework that are set.

<p>Art - Structures</p> <p>Can you build a strong bridge? You could make a bridge from lego, or recycled materials!</p> 	<p>Science - Plants</p> <p>Can you plant a seed and help it grow? Cress and beans are great plants to grow quickly. What does your plant need to help it grow?</p> 	<p>Geography - The Seven Continents</p> <p>Choose a continent to research and make a poster. Can you name countries in this continent? What is the weather like? What different types of places and animals can be found there?</p> 
<p>English</p> <p>Keep a log of the books you enjoy reading. You might take photos of the books and you reading them, you might write a review or choose your favourite book to write and draw pictures about.</p> 	<p>RE - Judaism - Shabbat</p> <p>Share a special meal with your family. What do you eat? How does it make you feel? How is your special family meal the same or different to the Jewish Shabbat meal?</p> 	<p>PSHE - Relationships</p> <p>Create a poster to show the special relationships you have in your life. Who are your family? What do you enjoy doing together?</p>
