Can you design a mural that you would like on one of the walls in your bedroom?	Research a famous scientist who created an important electrical invention and present your findings (e.g. Edison, Faraday, Franklin).	Choose one of the Scandinavian or Nordic countries and create a display including key information, landscape, currency, landmarks, climate etc.
Survey	R.E – Humanism	PSHE – Relationships
Create a survey of your family/friends favourite Present it in either a bar graph or as a pictogram.	How should we be treated? Create a poster about how people should be treated and give examples of how to show respect and kindness towards others.	Write a card to someone special. Who will you choose to write a card to? Why is this person special to you? How do they make you feel? Create and write a card to someone special to let them know what they mean to you. You can choose anyone you like.
