Year 1: Summer term - 1

We will be starting off with a 'Fast forward' block of work based on 'At the end of the Rainbow':

English

• A rainbow shape poem.

Summer 1 -

• A letter from Josie to a friend telling them about the adventure.

 A description of a rainbow image using similes and adjectives.

'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' by Judith Kerr.

• A shopping list of food to buy in case a tiger or another animal comes to tea.

• Sophie's supper was 'lovely'. Can you make a list of synonyms for this word?

- What happens to the tiger next? Brainstorm ideas. Write a short story about where he goes next and what happens.
- Add some speech / thought bubbles to the illustrations in the story. What are the characters thinking / saying?
 We will be learning new skills such as using:
- suffixes that can be added to verbs- flying, called, appeared
- Similes

• Complex sentences: Use of 'who' (relative clause).

We will be move on to a 'Instructions' block of work based on 'How to make fairy dust'. And 'How to find gold' by Viviane Schwarz. Maths

Summer 1 -

Multiplication and Division. Small steps include counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, making equal groups, add equal groups, make arrays, making doubles, make equal groups - grouping, and sharing.

Fractions. Small steps include finding a half of a shape, finding a half of a number, finding a quarter of a shape and finding a quarter of a number.

Position and Direction. Small steps include describing turn (quarter turn, half turn, three quarter turn and full turn) and describing position (left, right, above, below, forwards, backwards, etc).
