Please see below for the homework challenges relating to this half term. Children are asked to complete at least one challenge however, they can complete as many as they wish!

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| <p><u>Creative</u></p> <p>Create some art work linked to the night sky.</p> <p>You can use coloured pencils, collage materials, shiny tin foil or paint.</p>  | <p><u>English</u></p> <p>Can you create an Autumn picture poem?</p> <p>A U T U M N</p> <p>Ask your adult to help you. Draw something autumnal for each letter and colour it in.</p> | <p><u>Maths</u></p> <p>Challenge - Can you begin to problem solve and think critically?</p> <p>There are 5 apples. They can be red or green. Colour them in to show the different ways they could be. (Please see sheet in your child's book bag to complete the challenge!)</p> |
| <p><u>Knowledge</u></p>  <p>Build a model of a house that you think would stay standing if the Big Bad Wolf huffed and puffed. You could use lego bricks, blocks, duplo, junk modelling. Ask your grown up to make some wind and test it out!.</p> | <p><u>Knowledge</u></p> <p>Watch the video for inspiration and then draw and colour a 'nocturnal' animal. Think about what you can see, hear and smell! Draw a picture, colour it in and ask your adult to help you label it.</p>  |
