Funding approved for the renovation of the Clenchwarton Play Area

Plans are progressing for the renovation of the Clenchwarton Play Area at the playing field in the Village. A working group of representatives from the Parish Council and the community have been working hard over the last year to secure funding for the project following the survey that was carried out in January 2021.

Since then, the working group has successfully secured £116,000 from the Borough Council's Community Infrastructure Levy (£10,000), FCC Communities Foundation (£77,870) and developer contributions (£27,329) from The Laurel Farm housing development, under construction on the Main Road in Clenchwarton.

The results of the survey last year have directly contributed to shaping the plans for the play area. 185 people from the community responded to the survey, 96% said they feel the play area needs upgrading. The survey also revealed that 82% said limited range of equipment was a barrier to using the play area. Equipment that respondent's most wanted to see included a slide, zip wire, climbing net, sea saw and swing seat.

The results of this survey are now feeding into the next stage of the project. The working group will be issuing a tender for companies to submit their prices and design proposals for the play area. The play area will be designed for 0 – 15 year olds and will retain the swings from the existing play area which the community said they would like to see remain.

The Chairman of the working group and Parish Councillor Steve Bearshaw said *'the working group have been working really hard behind the scenes over the last year to secure funding for the project and we are thrilled that we have been able to secure enough funding to renovate the area. It will provide a real boost to the young residents of the village. We are excited to be able to move forward to the next stage and invite specialist play area companies to tender for the project. Our aim is have the renovation completed by the end of the year and will be keeping the community updated at each stage of the project as we progress.'*

The working group would be interested to hear from any young people and members of the community who would like to help assess the designs of the proposals when tenders are returned from companies, expected back in February 2022.
