[Make it Enjoyable!](#) Whatever you plan to do, the most important thing is that reading doesn't become a grind or, even worse, a punishment. Children become readers when they find a book they enjoy and once books make them happy, they are hooked for life. So don't discourage them from re-reading an old favourite or an old Beano annual, and don't keep encouraging them to read something you loved as a child if they're not keen. Guide and suggest, but as far as possible, let them make the choice themselves.
